#### CONSTRUCTION OF THE PRE-SCHOOL BUILDING AT KATARAGAMA

#### OPENING CEREMONY -BUILDING HANDED OVER TO PEOPLE OF KATARAGAMA

The construction of the above building was completed on the 15<sup>th</sup> October 2009 by the contractor. The building was opened by Rev. Fr. Damian Fernando, National Director Caritas Sri Lanka – SEDEC and blessed by Most Rev. Dr. J. Winston S Fernando, SSS Bishop of Badulla in the presence of Rev. Fr. Dilex Shantha Fernando, Director Caritas Badulla - USCOD Centre and the following officials:

- 2. Two local government leaders and Principal of the Kataragama M.Vidyalaya
- 3. Rev. Fr. Dilan Perera, OMI, Parish Priest of Buttala
- 4. Rev. Sisters of the Franciscan Convent, Kataragama
- 5. Religious Dignitaries
- 6. Parents of past students of this Pre-school and their children
- 7. A few staff members of Caritas Badulla USCOD Centre
- 8. Residents of this area

The opening ceremony and the proceedings that followed this occasion ended at 12.30 p.m. The children presented variety entertainments comprising singing, dancing, speeches and drama for the entertainment of all present. In between these activities speeches were given as mentioned below:-

- 1. Most Rev. Dr. J. Winston S Fernando, SSS said that this building would be a very useful one for the education of students in this area and it would not serve the purpose intended if the teachers, parents and others do not co-operate fully to serve the purposes intended in providing this building. He also kindly appreciated and thanked the donors for providing the necessary funds to construct this building.
- 2. Rev. Fr. Damian Fernando, National Director, Caritas Sri Lanka – SEDEC praised the activities of Caritas Badulla – USCOD Centre, its Director and staff. He said that he is very happy that he was able to contribute the



necessary funds for the construction of this building in order to conduct classes for the benefit of the children in the area.

3. Rev. Fr. Dilex Shantha Fernando, Director of Caritas Badulla – USCOD Centre thanked all those responsible for completing the construction of the building in four months. Specially he mentioned the names of Mr. Gerard Brandeson, Donor, Rev. Fr. Damian Fernando, Mr. K. Theivendirarajah, Programme Manager – Tsunami and the staff of Caritas Sri Lanka – SEDEC and all those who successfully completed the building in four months.

He assured that this Pre-school would function effectively for the benefit of the children in the area.

- 4. A parent of one of the students addressed the gathering and thanked all concerned for providing this Pre-school in the locality. He expressed that all parents participated to contribute their services in the construction of this building and that they observed the excellence of the standard of the construction of this building. He said that this building will last for a long time.
- 5. On the day of the opening of the building the children displayed their talents on the stage of the new building. The parents of the children and others who were present enjoyed their display.

## **MONITORING**

The Director of Caritas Badulla - USCOD Centre inspected the construction of the building twice a week and gave the instructions where necessary.

His Lordship the Bishop of Badulla and Bro. Roshantha, Technical Officer inspected the building regularly and they identified any shortcomings and gave the necessary instructions to rectify these.

In terms of Technical Officers advice the following changes on the building were carried out:-

As this area is subject hot weather the roof was covered with tiles instead of asbestos sheets and wooden roof purling was used in place of iron bars. The rest of the construction was carried out according to our plans.

parents of students of this Pre-school will help to inculcate the cultural and spiritual values in the minds of the students.


## Meetings & Seminars

This Pre-school is monitored and financed by Caritas Badulla – USCOD Centre with the financial help of Terre des Hommes, Netherlands.

The Parish Priest of the area as the Co-ordinator Priest conducts and manages this Pre-school. The Rev. Sisters of the Franciscan Convent of Kataragama help to conduct this Pre-school. The parents have formed a committee to contribute their services to develop the Pre-school infrastructure facilities and other involvements. The parents actively help the Co-ordinator Priest in the management of this Pre-school

Organize a year-end programme with the advocacy of the importance of ELC's and our priorities of the target groups. This provides a good opportunity for us to select suitable students to follow the studies in the Pre-school. Parents contribute as school fees a minimum fee of Rs. 50.00 per student per month. The maximum fee Rs. 250.00 which depend on their family income of parents. The Sisters of the Convent discuss with parents and decide on this matter. The Sisters maintain the accounts. The teachers are paid a salary with deduction of EPF and ETF which are sent monthly to the relevant government authorities.
